The position is located in the Food Systems and Food Safety Division (ESF) at FAO headquarters in Rome, Italy.

Reporting Lines

The Director of the Food Systems and Food Safety Division (ESF) reports to the Chief Economist of FAO.

Summary of Duties and Functions

Under the policy guidance and the general supervision of the Chief Economist and as a member of the Economic and Social Development Management Team, the Director will:

- provide intellectual leadership, strategic vision and promotion of the sustainable transformation of agrifood systems and improvements in food safety at the country, regional and global levels;
- lead and guide the work of the Organization on issues related to the transformation of agrifood systems and to food safety, including the promotion and coordination of cross-divisional support on issues of relevance to the Division;
- support and advise the Chief Economist and, as necessary, other Divisions/Offices at headquarters and the Decentralized Offices in the areas related to the Division's competence;
- ensure the inclusion of issues related to agrifood systems and food safety in the FAO Strategic Framework;
- provide leadership to the Priority Programme Areas under the Division's overall responsibility in Food Safety, Food Loss and Waste, and Urban Food Systems;
- prioritize and manage the planning, implementation, monitoring and quality control of Divisional work plans and be accountable for the delivery of products and services in support of the FAO Strategic Framework;
- support the development and implementation of an effective staff capacity development strategy, ensuring the recruitment of highly qualified staff as well as mentoring, coaching and supporting career development;
- maintain a motivated and effective work force and a results-oriented work environment;
- advocate for and promote the work of the Division and the building of partnerships with FAO Members, international and national organizations, as well as the private sector, as appropriate;
- contribute to, and provide leadership to, the Division's resource mobilization efforts;
- represent the Organization at high-level meetings and other events dealing with issues relevant to the Division's mandate and areas of work;
- perform other duties and functions as required.

Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in Economics, Agricultural Economics, Food Technology, Food Science, Food Safety or related field;
- Demonstrated intellectual, managerial and technical leadership of a high order in the relevant subject areas;
- At least fifteen years of experience in the areas of agriculture, agrifood systems, food safety, rural development and related policies;
- Management experience, interpersonal and communication skills as demonstrated in leading and working effectively with large teams of people of different national and cultural backgrounds in an international environment;
- Working knowledge (proficient – level C) of English and limited knowledge (intermediate – level B) of one of the other FAO official languages (Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian or Spanish).
